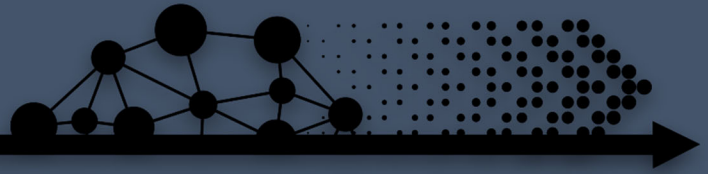

Northeastern University's Curry Student Center is located at 346 Huntington Avenue, Boston, MA 02115

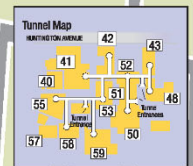
From the Columbus Garage, use the Pedestrian Bridge and walk straight. The Curry Student Center is on the left.
